“Hey, what’s up? It’s Tutt Jones, and I’m here to share my journey from the Central Jersey Shore to Los Angeles and beyond as my rap career unfolds. Growing up, I always felt like the odd one out. I was born in Camden, NJ, with strong family ties to Miami, and my music and fashion became an escape from the challenging reality I often faced. Right from the beginning, I was determined to stay true to myself, no matter how difficult it got or the bullying I had to endure. I was heavily influenced by hip hop, Disney, Nickelodeon, and MTV, which inspired me to create a persona that was provocative, flamboyant, and full of life.

In school, I was popular but never quite fit in. It was during this time that I began to understand the hardships faced by LGBTQIA+ individuals, particularly those of color. This experience has consistently shaped my rap style, which often explores themes of sexuality, awareness, and fearlessness.

It wasn’t an easy journey. I worked numerous odd jobs and even ended up in jail for committing crimes. I started college with a focus on fashion merchandising and business management but dropped out to pursue my dream of becoming a rapper.

Along the way, I faced challenges such as my immediate family never fully accepting me, the loss of my brother in 2019, and unintentional mistreatment from my mother. Despite it all, I never gave up and have continued to fight against homophobia within the black community, embracing my non-binary identity, and learning to love myself more and more.

This is what drives me now = my path to becoming a Grammy-winning rapper, all while remembering where I came from. I want to embody the change I wish to see in the world, and I’m making my mark one song at a time. So brace yourself because Tutt Jones is here to shake things up.”<sup>77</sup>

Knowing you're in the most dangerous area around your area was arousing, now if I'm you and you're me, we just realised that being anything but loved by DL men was really where I wanted to be. The abuse felt different and I was addicted, drug dealers, scammers, married men, police officers, school security guards.

I'm wanted and these men show me praise. I mean I like to FUCK too. Especially when I know once I'm done being full of him I'd be going home in a new pair of soes. I was a product to be used and the pay was their dues. Nevermind him trying to kill me and fucking his cousin again while he was in jail because that's just who you are. You were gonna FUCK anyway just not in the back of a car. At 16 you realised you had a real knack and a true obsession with basically anything you weren't supposed to have.

Imagine getting anything you want because these men would give anything to abuse the pretty and hurt, especially when pretty likes it rough. You're pretty aren't you.

Now imagine him stalking you. Imagine liking it. A lot. Being seventeen all I knew was I wanted what wanted me and that was never the best. But if he wanted me and I was so hard to love why not be easy to FUCK but hard to touch. Imagine reading a MySpace message from your neighbour saying "you looked drunk when you stumbled in, do you want some company?" Imagine saying "come see wassup". Imagine him climbing through your window and grabbing you by your neck. Tall, brown, basketball player, cut arms, built chest, long legs. Your 5'7 and he's 6'2. He smelled like Axe, the blue one. Haszel eyes, short cut. His brother was my weed man. He was the coke dude so he liked money and you were

money, talking, walking money, a slave to the unavailable. Now imagine for the first time you're noticing your dick is hard while being fucked on the floor of your bedroom floor with three fingers in your throat and ten inches full. Imagine him noticing and wanting to get fucked too. Imagine taking his virginity. Imagine knowing right then that the songs you would write about. In this life, here on out, would be your way of talking about, what a lifestyle that people could only imagine feels like.

Now I'm me and you're you. I'm Tutt Jones and it's a pleasure to meet me. My music is not a parody or an ode to a good ole gay life. My music is the strength I have obtained from the consistent beatings of societal norms. I mix that, with my knowledge of high fashion and unfiltered lyrics and you have a legend, polished, extreme, manic, well versed thug. Now FUCK w/ me.
