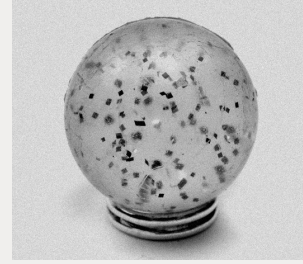


Superball No. 7 (AI104-KE)

CONTAINMENT PROCEDURE:

Item is to be housed in a sealed reinforced cell no larger than 2 feet by 2 feet. The cell must remain sealed at all times. Item is not to be handled directly. Four agents were injured during initial transport attempting to interrupt the item's trajectory. Their incident reports are on file. Three have been cleared for active duty. The status of the fourth is [REDACTED].

DESCRIPTION / ALTERED EFFECT:

Item is a rubber vending machine ball, yellow and translucent, with multicolored confetti suspended throughout its interior, approximately 45mm in diameter. Purchased from a vending machine outside a [REDACTED] store in Singapore, in 1987. It has been bouncing in continuous motion since.

Bureau physicists have documented no measurable loss of momentum. No energy source has been identified. Attempts to model the trajectory have produced results described by the lead analyst as "consistent, but wrong in the way of learned physics."

The sound the item produces upon impact does not correspond to its location. Audio analysis confirms the impact sound originates from different places entirely. In several documented cases these do not correspond to any known location within the Bureau. Acoustics analysts have been cataloguing the ambient sounds present in these recordings since [REDACTED]. They have not released their findings.

BACKGROUND:

The item was brought to Bureau attention by a national who reported purchasing the ball for his daughter outside a [REDACTED] on [REDACTED], 1987. He reported that the ball, once dropped, did not stop. Bureau agents were dispatched to retrieve it. See attached incident reports for details of the transport.
