I am writing to flag what I believe to be an ongoing distraction within the Records and Filing department. I want to be clear that this is not a personal matter. I simply feel it is the kind of thing HR should be made aware of.

[REDACTED] and [REDACTED] have, over the past several weeks, developed what I would describe as an unnecessary degree of familiarity. This includes but is not limited to: extended conversations near the printer on the [REDACTED] floor, shared lunches in the break room on non-designated lunch hours, and a pattern of arriving at and departing from the building within close proximity of one another. I have noted this on multiple occasions. I was not looking for it.

On [REDACTED], [REDACTED] brought [REDACTED] a coffee. This is not standard Bureau practice. The coffee appeared to have been prepared exactly as [REDACTED] takes it. I do not know how [REDACTED] would know this. I have worked in this department for [REDACTED] years and no one has ever brought me a coffee.

I am not suggesting any violation of Bureau policy has occurred. I am suggesting that the level of attentiveness being directed toward one specific colleague, during work hours, on Bureau time, is worth reviewing. Productivity in the department has not measurably declined. I checked.

I am available to provide further observations if needed. I have several.
